- 3. Your work may be composed in at least two (or as many as five) of the following forms:
 - a) A short story
 - Note: If you write a longer story, each chapter counts as one piece of writing.
 - b) A topical essay or report
 - c) A letter to or from your character
 - d) A journal entry by your character
 - e) A newspaper article discussing your character &/or their situation
 - f) A letter to the editor on the topic of children at work
 - g) A poem exploring this topic
 - h) A song on this topic
- 4. Each one of your five pieces should be a minimum of 150 words and a maximum of two pages (one page, front and back).
- 5. You are welcome but not required to incorporate artwork into your composition work.
- 6. Your work may be written by hand or typed.
- 7. Please be sure to put your name on every composition.
- 8. Gather your summer writing into a single portfolio or document.
- 9. Turn in your work on the first day of school!
