## **Composition 7**

Your first composition class will be your <u>final</u> short story work period. Once you turn in your story, you may begin working on your Frost portfolio during composition class.

- ( ) Read 24 (or more) Frost poems. Record "Poem Titles" along with your notes regarding Frost's great lines, recurring themes, style, and more.
- ( ) Take a web quest & notes to compose a two-paragraph biography of Frost.
- ( ) Complete a close reading (analysis AND interpretation) of one poem.
- ( ) Memorize and recite at least two Frost poems.

- ( ) Translate a short poem into French or Spanish or Latin &/or ...?
- ( ) Compose two poems to demonstrate your mastery of Frost's poetics.
- ( ) Construct a creative response to Frost's work.

  This might be a short film, a Keynote presentation, an art, music, or dance project, a poem sequence, or an illuminated manuscript.
